Here is a list of some of the scholarships you might consider when financing your education abroad:

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship enables students who have limited financial means to participate in study abroad opportunities worldwide. To be eligible, students must be receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of application and cannot be studying abroad in a country currently under a U.S. Department of State Travel Warning, or in Cuba. <http://www.iie.org/gilman/>

Freeman Grant is specifically for students who would like to study in Asia. <http://www.iie.org/pgms/freeman-asia/>

National Security Education Program is a U.S. Government program to promote study in certain non-western countries. The program involves a national competition, and UR students have won scholarships in recent years. <http://www.iie.org/nsep/>

In addition to the Gilman Scholarships, the National Security Education Program, and the Freeman Grant, the Institute for International Education sponsors a variety of other scholarship programs.

Rotary International Ambassadorial Scholarship is a long-standing scholarship program for study abroad. Students apply through the local Rotary club. Application deadlines are extremely early, so this requires advanced planning. http://www.rotary.org/foundation/educational/amb_scho/index.html

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) offers Undergraduate Awards to highly qualified undergraduate students for study abroad, senior thesis research and/or internships in the Federal Republic of Germany. Awards are for a Semester or Year

Abroad, ranging from four to ten months, either as part of an organized study abroad program, or as an individual, student-designed study abroad semester or year.
